



2013 Year in Review

The following is a snapshot of what Second Harvest of South Georgia was able to achieve in the fight against hunger last year:

BY THE NUMBERS:

- 18.6 million Pounds of food distributed to those in need
- 205,565 Pounds of food collected through Postal Food Drive
- 22,287 Hours provided by volunteers.
(That's the equivalent of 11 full-time employees!)
- 400 Volunteers participated in Make a Difference Day
- 170% Increase in pounds of food distributed since 2008
- 30% Increase in food distributed over 2012
- 60% Increase in the number of children served over 2013

OTHER NOTABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

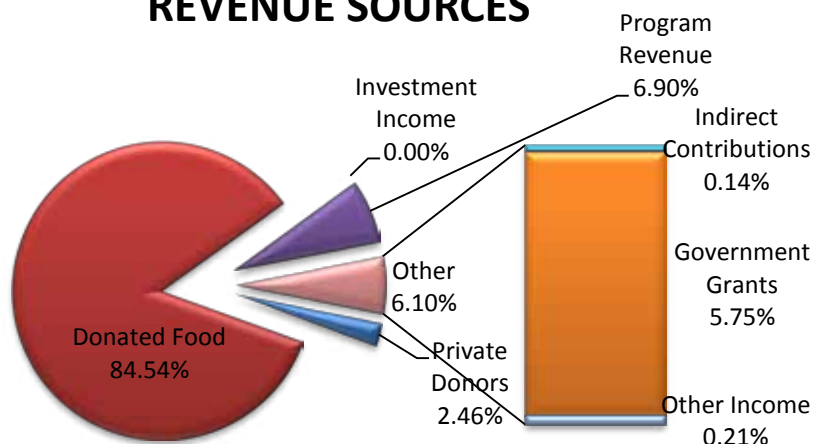
- Opened new Arby's Foundation Kids Cafe Kitchen in Albany branch

2013 was another great year for Second Harvest - marked with great successes! We know there is still much work to be done and we appreciate your support of our work



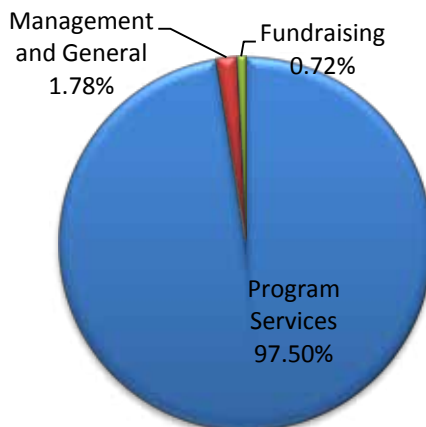
Financial Reporting 2013

Second Harvest receives the majority of its funding from individual and corporate donors, as well as private grants.

OUR WORK

The mission of Second Harvest of South Georgia is feeding those in need; our vision is a South Georgia without hunger. This sounds simple, but hunger is an enormous problem in this area. Our service regions has the highest rates of food insecurity in the state and among the highest in the nation. We work with more than 450 partner agencies and operate a variety of programs including the food bank, Kids' Cafe, Farm to Family, Teachers' Harvest, and our Mobile Food Pantry. We serve a 30 county area of approximately 13,000 square miles. In this area, 1 in 4 people struggle with hunger including 1 in 3 South Georgia children.
