



The following is a snapshot of what Second Harvest of South Georgia was able to achieve in the fight against hunger last year:

BY THE NUMBERS:

- 18.26 million Pounds of food distributed
- 14 million Meals* distributed to those in need
- 16,702 Hours provided by volunteers. (Equivalent of 8 full-time employees)
- 3,000 Children fed each day through Kids Cafe
- 200% Increase in number of teachers served through Teachers' Harvest

OTHER NOTABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Opened our new Thomasville Distribution Center in May at a standing-room only grand opening attended by Congressmen Austin Scott and Sanford Bishop
- Doubled the size of our Farm to Family produce program
- Opened our Thomasville Kids Cafe kitchen in November with help from the Arby's Foundation
- Hosted Deputy Secretary of Agriculture Krysta Harden who helped at a mobile food pantry event

2014 was a banner year for Second Harvest!

We saw some large projects come to fruition and have begun to gain some national attention for our efforts. We celebrate the strides we've made but know that there is still a long race yet to run. Thank you for supporting our work and believing in our mission!



Meals are calculated using the US Department of Agriculture standard of 1.5 pounds of food/meal



Second Harvest of South Georgia, a qualified 501 (c)(3) organization, utilizes **97.13% of every donation** to support our program services which include the Food Bank, Kids Cafe, Mobile Food Pantry, Product Recovery, Farm to Family and Teachers' Harvest. Second Harvest receives the majority of its funding from individual and corporate donors, as well as private grants. (Figures above are unaudited.)

OUR WORK

The mission of Second Harvest of South Georgia is feeding those in need; our vision is a South Georgia without hunger. This sounds simple, but hunger is an enormous problem in this area. Our service regions has the highest rates of food insecurity in the state and among the highest in the nation. We work with more than 450 partner agencies and operate a variety of programs including the food bank, Kids' Cafe, Farm to Family, Teachers' Harvest, and our Mobile Food Pantry. We serve a 30 county area of approximately 13,000 square miles. In this area, 1 in 4 people struggle with hunger including 1 in 3 South Georgia children.
